GREAT FOR: Low Sunlight

FEATURES:

Low Maintenance, Air Purifying

GROWTH RATE: Slow in low light



LIGHT

Prefers bright, indirect light but can tolerate low light as well. Avoid direct sunlight.



DIFFICULTY

Easy! Just make sure the plant isn't in direct sunlight and don't overwater.



FERTILIZER

Feed with a mild liquid, indoor plant fertilizer about 1-2 times a month during the growing season.



PRUNING & PROPAGATION

Prune yellow or damaged leaves by cutting to the leaf node. If leggy, prune stems down to 4-8 inches tall to stimulate new growth. To propagate, large plants can be divided.







WATER

Allow soil to mostly dry out but not completely. Water less often in winter.



TEMPERATURE

Prefers warm conditions above 60°F. Keep away from drafty windows and air conditioners.



SOIL

A peaty All-Purpose potting soil with good drainage works best.



PET FRIENDLY?

Sorry! Plant contains very sharp calcium oxalate crystals that, when eaten, cause mouth and digestion irritation.
