



AGLAONEMA SIAM

The Aglaonema Siam is a low-maintenance evergreen that tolerates most indoor conditions, making it a great choice for people who are new to plant care. With large, oval leaves featuring speckles of pink, the Aglaonema Siam requires bright, indirect sunlight in order to maintain its colors. While the Aglaonema Siam will periodically produce flowers, the plant is generally prized for its lush foliage and remarkable adaptability.

GROWTH RATE: Slow to Moderate



LIGHT

Prefers bright, indirect light to maintain bright colors but can tolerate low light as well. Avoid direct sunlight.



LEVEL OF CARE

Easy! Just make sure the plant isn't in direct sunlight and don't overwater.



FERTILIZER

Feed with a mild liquid, indoor plant fertilizer about 1-2 times a month during the growing season. Do not fertilize in winter.



PRUNING & PROPAGATION

Prune yellow or damaged leaves by cutting to the leaf node. If leggy, prune stems down to 4-8 inches tall to stimulate new growth. To propagate, large plants can be divided.



WATER

About once every 10-14 days. Allow soil to mostly dry out, but not completely. Water less often in winter.



TEMPERATURE

Prefers warm conditions above 60°F. Keep away from drafty windows and air conditioners.



SOIL

A peaty All-Purpose potting soil with good drainage works best.



PET FRIENDLY?

Sorry! Plant contains very sharp calcium oxalate crystals that, when eaten, cause mouth and digestion irritation.
