

CALATHEA PEACOCK *Calathea makoyana*

The Calathea Peacock features round or oval light-green leaves with silver-white patterns and dark-green edges, while the undersides of the leaves are deep burgundy or purple. Rarely producing flowers as a houseplant, Calathea Peacocks are generally prized for foliage that stands out in any setting. Pet-friendly and easy to care for, the Calathea Peacock is the perfect plant for spaces with bright indirect to low sunlight.

LIGHT

Prefers bright, indirect light but can tolerate low light as well. Avoid direct sunlight.



LEVEL OF CARE

Easy! Just make sure the plant isn't in direct sunlight and don't overwater.



FERTILIZER

Feed with a mild liquid, indoor plant fertilizer about once a month during the growing season. Do not fertilize in winter.



PRUNING & PROPAGATION

Prune yellow or damaged leaves down to stem. To propagate, large plants can be divided in the spring.



WATER

Prefers soil to partially dry out so check about once a week. Thrives in a moist environment with high humidity. Water less in winter.



TEMPERATURE

Prefers warm conditions 65-80°F. Keep away from drafty windows and air conditioners.



SOIL

A peaty All-Purpose potting soil with good drainage works best.
