



## PONYTAIL PALM *Beaucarnea recurvata*

The Ponytail Palm is not actually a palm at all; it is a member of the agave family and is a succulent. Also called Elephant Foot, the Ponytail Palm has long, narrow, hair-like leaves and a bulbous trunk that stores water. The Ponytail Palm is remarkably low-maintenance, making it the perfect plant for beginners or people always on the go.

### FEATURES:

### GROWTH RATE: Slow



#### LIGHT

Prefers bright, indirect light but can tolerate low light as well.



#### WATER

Allow soil to completely dry out. Water less often in winter.



#### LEVEL OF CARE

Easy! Just avoid direct sunlight and don't overwater.



#### TEMPERATURE

Prefers warm conditions 65-80°F. Keep away from drafty windows and air conditioners.



#### FERTILIZER

Feed with a mild liquid, indoor plant fertilizer about once a month during the growing season.



#### SOIL

A peaty All-Purpose potting soil with good drainage works best.



#### PRUNING & PROPAGATION

Prune brown leaves or tips using sharp scissors. To propagate, seeds are required.

Yes! Ponytail Palms are non-toxic to cats and dogs.
