

SPATHIPHYLLUM *Spathiphyllum*

The Spathiphyllum, commonly known as the Peace Lily, are low-maintenance, hardy indoor plants, recognizable by their glossy dark green leaves and bright white spathes. These indoor plants have been noted for the air purification abilities, releasing oxygen and leveling the humidity in the air.

GREAT FOR: Moderate Sunlight

FEATURES:
Long-Lasting Blooms

GROWTH RATE: Slow



LIGHT

Prefers bright, indirect light but can tolerate low light as well. Avoid direct sunlight.



DIFFICULTY

Easy! Just avoid direct sun and don't overwater.



FERTILIZER

Feed with a mild liquid, indoor plant fertilizer about 1-2 times a month during the growing season. Do not fertilize in winter.



PRUNING & PROPAGATION

Prune yellow or damaged stems down to soil level. To propagate, large plants can be divided.



WATER

About once a week. Allow soil to mostly dry out, but not completely. Water less often in winter. If leaves develop brown tips, air may be too dry.



TEMPERATURE

Prefers warm conditions above 60°F. Keep away from drafty windows and air conditioners.



SOIL

A peaty All-Purpose potting soil with good drainage works best.
